Early Year's Curriculum

All children in Reception follow a curriculum called the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) and this is broken down into 3 prime aspects and 4 specific areas of learning.

General Information

Lunch at school

- School dinners and packed lunches are both eaten in the school hall. Adults will support the children and help them.
- Please try and order online what your child would like in advance and tell your child what they are having! This is via Parent Pay
- Packed lunches: NO NUTS (Nutella or other types of this spread are not allowed) cut up grapes and cherry tomatoes.
- Food your child does not eat will be in their lunch box so you will see how much they have eaten.







Key Groups

Your child will be allocated a key person at the beginning of the first term. Each day we start with a key group time. These small groups help the children get to know the routine, take turns in talking and listening and find out what is happening every day.

The children will talk about their feelings and get ready for the day. Each group is named after a fruit, your child will soon be telling you they are a watermelon, strawberry, raspberry, apple!

The role of the key person is as follows:

- Ensure your child feels safe and secure.
- Respond to children's needs and help them to settle and become confident learners.
- Provide opportunities to take part in small group activities.
- Help children learn the routine of the day and the Reception timetable.












Phonics

- Phonics teaching is a key part of the Reception day.
- Phonics is a way of teaching children how to read and write. It helps children hear, identify and use different sounds that distinguish one word from another in the English language.

We will be holding a phonics meeting for parents and carers to give you more information about how we teach phonics and what you can do to help support your child at home.





Reading Books

Every child will have one fully decodable book

- The fully decodable book will be matched to the child's current secure knowledge and understanding of GPCs.
- Children should be reading fully decodable books at 90% fluency in class and at 95% fluency for home reading.
- A 'sharing book' is for the parent/carer to read to the child to explore vocabulary and allows discussion with their child. This is not for the child to decode as it will be above what they have been taught in class.

Phonics Parent Meetings

To allow you to get a more detailed insight to Phonics and how we teach Unlocking Letters and Sounds there will be a workshop on Monday 19th September.


Reception Baseline Assessment (RBA)

The children in Reception will be participating in the RBA within the first 6 weeks of starting reception.



What is the RBA?

- It is statutory for all schools from September 2021
- A short interactive and practical assessment of your child's
- early literacy, communication, language and mathematical skills
- The main purpose is to create a starting point to measure the progress schools make with their pupils.
- It is not about judging or labelling your child or putting them under any pressure.
- · Your child cannot 'pass' or 'fail' the assessment.
